

HEAD START & EARLY HEAD START

Head Start and Early Head Start serve pregnant mothers and families with children 0-5 years of age with individualized teaching and education, health screenings, nutrition, family and community engagement, mental health and disability services.

SELF-SUFFICIENCY PROGRAM

The Self-Sufficiency Program assists families and individuals to recover from economic setbacks with housing, emergency help and work related needs. In addition case management may be provided. This program includes transitional housing for homeless individuals and veterans as well as affordable housing for families.

KINSHIP SUPPORT SERVICES

Kinship Support Services assist kinship providers with guardianship papers, case management, referrals and information regarding local resources and services. Kinship hosts monthly meetings, providing dinner, respite and training sessions.

FARMER'S MARKET

Since August 1981, the Cheyenne Farmers Market has been one of Cheyenne's most popular events. Operating as an annual fundraiser for Community Action of Laramie County, it allows local and regional vendors a venue to sell their produce, honey and jams, bakery items and other local product. The market is located at the Depot Plaza, it starts the first Saturday in August and runs through the first Saturday of October.

Crossroads Healthcare Clinic is a federally funded health care program providing primary medical care to individuals and families who are or have been homeless in the past year. Patients include people living temporarily in motels, sleeping on the streets, residing in short-term residential and treatment facilities or doubling up with friends and family. We are also able to treat a small percentage of low income individuals and families.



HEALTH CARE CLINIC

Primary Health Care
and limited Dental Care.

Prescription Assistance
for our patients who are income eligible (subject to board approved formulary).

Health Education
Including information about AIDS, tuberculosis, contraception, STD's, diabetes, hypertension, asthma, as well as other illnesses and health issues.

Transportation
Assistance to health care appointments with rides and bus tokens.

Case Management Services
Assistance in accessing federal, state and private resources for individuals striving to become self-sufficient.

MENTAL HEALTH & SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Assistance is provided through referrals and in coordination with Peak Wellness Center and agreements with Cheyenne Regional Behavioral Health Services.

MOBILE CLINIC

The mobile clinic provides medical services in the community to help reduce transportation barriers. This is a limited service site which consists of assessment, treatment and referral of uncomplicated health care needs. Services provided on the mobile clinic include TB testing, flu shots, prescription refill requests and case management services.

Patients with more complex health care needs will be scheduled in our main clinic.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SERVICES

Individuals and/or families who meet the following definition:

- a) An individual who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.
- b) An individual who has a primary residence defined as one of the following:
 - A supervised or publicly operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations;
 - An institution that provides a temporary residence for individuals intended to be institutionalized;
 - A public or private place not designed for or used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
